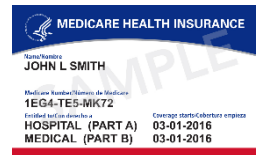

ATTENTION SENIORS 75+

St. Paul's Lutheran Church of Sassamansville is teaming up with The Medicine Shoppe, Boyertown Area School District, and other Boyertown community organizations to vaccinate our area's Senior Community against Covid-19

How does it work?

- 1) Volunteers from St. Paul's will be calling our members to register you for the vaccine if you are interested.
- 2) Once doses are available, we will call you back to set up your vaccination appointment. Please use the top of this flyer to document your appointment date and time.
- 3) The vaccine clinic will be held in the Boyertown Area Senior High library. Participants are asked to park in the East Parking Lot and enter the library through the East Entrance.
- 4) You must wear a face mask and bring a photo ID and your Medicare Part B card (Red White and Blue card)
- 5) Once you are registered at the clinic, you will receive your vaccine. After the shot is administered, you will be required to remain at the clinic for at least 15 minutes to make sure that do not experience any type of allergic reaction.



Who is eligible?

Anyone who is 75 or older and lives in Boyertown Area School District or is associated with a participating Boyertown organization. We hope to expand to more age groups in the future.

What else do I need to know?

The Medicine Shoppe is providing the actual vaccines and is at the mercy of state organizations when it comes to receipt of the vaccines. There may come a time when we need to reschedule clinics due to a lack of vaccines.

If you have received your first vaccine from another healthcare provider, pharmacy, etc., we kindly ask that you finish the two-vaccine process with the same organization that you started with.

If for any reason, you need to cancel your appointment, please notify us ASAP at 1-855-268-4636. Once the vaccines are thawed for administration they must be used or discarded. Therefore, we want to make sure to waste as little of the vaccines as possible. Thank you for your cooperation.
