Note from Pastor Matt

This month I wanted to recap somethings discussed at the congregational meeting in January so that everyone can hear it.

There is that old saying, "the only constant is change." Yes, as we move through life things do change. We grow older; people move away; major events arrive in our lives that force us to change. Just because change comes does not mean that it is easy or welcomed. In large part the Church (the whole Church not just this congregation) is slow to change. That is for good reason. We are disciples of a teacher who walked this earth 2000 years ago. We have over the centuries developed beliefs and traditions that we believe come to us from God. The God we worship is the same "yesterday, today, and tomorrow." We have good reason for embracing change slowly or resisting certain changes entirely.

Yet we do not live in the world of Jesus or the apostles. The world around has changed and therefore the people God calls on us to minister to have also changed. Even though we do not live in the world of the Bible, the Bible still speaks to our world with the timeless message of the good news of Jesus Christ. The question for the church is how do we best minster to a changing world and communicate that message in a way that people can hear it?



This is not a new challenge for the church; this has been the continual task of the church from day one. Different people and groups within the church have always had different approaches to this challenge. Peter and Paul had different approaches to this challenge; it is not new. All of this is to say that change is here, and we as the congregation of St. Paul's must respond.

I don't need to rehash the situation of the Church in North America. We know it; we live it. Across the board but especially for the older, established churches, the Church is experiencing decline. Attendance, giving, and engagement are down. The average age within congregations is up. Funerals far outnumber baptisms. I have now been Pastor at St. Paul's for three full years. Those trends were felt here before my arrival, and they have continued after my arrival. As much as I would like to believe that my presence as Pastor would reverse those trends, I know that I don't have the power to do that.

For 2020 we have presented and approved a budget where our expenses outnumber our expected income by about \$35,000. This is in line with the budgets of the previous few years. We have the money in savings to cover the deficit, but in the long term this is not a sustainable arrangement. I also write this knowing that I as Pastor represent the single biggest line item in our budget every year. The leadership of the Synod has approached the congregation with an opportunity that we need to consider.



As you may be aware Christ Lutheran Church in Niantic is in a call process for a new pastor. The congregation, however has voted to call a pastor on a half time basis only. This move is largely about what the congregation sees as their needs and what they can sustainably afford in the future. We, the congregation of St. Paul's, have been asked to consider a shared ministry arrangement where I would serve both St. Paul's and Christ Lutheran. Essentially, my call here

would move to a half time type arrangement and I would be contracted to serve Christ Lutheran half time as well. My call will remain with St. Paul's and if things do not work out with Christ Lutheran I would be able to remain pastor at St. Paul's. Such an arrangement would mean some changes for the life and ministry here at St. Paul's, but it would also mean a significant cost savings for the congregation.

These type of "multi-point" arrangements are not unusual, especially in other parts of the church, but they have not been the norm in this area for many years. All of the Lutheran congregations in this area, however, began with clergy serving multiple congregations and these arrangements continued in various forms for generations. My previous call was to a two point parish, so I do have experience in navigating the issues that come along with such an arrangement. Exploring this change to the life and ministry at St. Paul's could mean a more stable and sustainable financial footing for many years to come.

Any change to the terms of my call here at St. Paul's will require a congregational vote. If we move forward in this process we will call a special congregational meeting sometime in the next year to approve any changes. As we explore this possibility please voice any questions or concerns that you may have. You can contact me directly or any member of the congregation council.

In the meantime I ask you to pray. Pray for the Church (the whole Church not just St. Paul's). Pray for each other. Pray for the community around us. Pray for those not yet part of the Church. Pray for your Pastor. Pray that we would be guided by God's vision and mission. Pray that we see what God calls us to do and that God gives us the strength and the courage to pursue it.
