#### **Note from Pastor Matt**

Right now, I get at least one e-mail per day advertising a book, article, or seminar about the "post-pandemic" church. This is understandable. The pandemic has greatly affected everything we do over the past year and a half or so. Couple that with the ways that previous pandemics have led to long standing societal changes and it seems to be clear that post-pandemic life will not be exactly the same as pre-pandemic life and this includes the church.

What those changes will be however is not so clear. Each of those books, articles, and seminars has a vison of post-pandemic life that they are trying to sell, but those visions are not all the same. Some see the shift to more online forms of church as permanent. People got a taste for church from the family room or church on demand and they will not want to give that up. Others argue that because people have been forced to use more virtual and online means for worship that they will be eager to leave that behind for embodied, in-person forms. In reality, it will not likely be one thing or the other but some mixture of the two, and how that sorts itself out will be different in different places and contexts.

What I really want to discuss though is the unspoken assumption behind all these competing visions for the future of the church. Each vision assumes a consumer mentality when it comes to members and prospective members of the church. What I mean is each vision takes it for granted that people will gravitate to the church that best meets their needs and provides them the best return on their "investment" of time, talent, and treasure. In this vision the church is just another product or service for sale. If someone wants a professional, polished online service that meets their unique needs then they will find the congregation that delivers that, even if that congregation is not in their local area. If someone seeks a congregation with an abundance of in-person activities and programs to choose from then they will find the congregation that provides the most choice and the best run programs. The choice of congregation becomes just another consumer choice like where to shop for groceries or clothing.



Of course, everyone does not look at church this way, but these visions and others do assume that increasing numbers of people will look at church this way. The traditional things that did influence where one would worship, like family ties, proximity, and denominational loyalty have lost influence over the years. Congregations large and small are tempted to view outreach and evangelism as a question of, "how do we compete in the marketplace?" Congregations can fall into that assumption without even realizing it. It is natural that as we look out on a world that has changed in ways we do not yet fully realize, we will bring some of those unspoken assumptions to our response.

So, what does a faithful response to an uncertain, changing world look like? Remember first that it is God's church not ours. The Church is the body of Christ in the world and Christ is the one who acts in the power of the Holy Spirit. The gospel is powerful because God is at work through it, and our task is to share it with the world around us. As we navigate change, our question is "how do we best

share the gospel and build up faith?" If we are focused on that rather than competing in the marketplace then we are on the right track.

What will the post-pandemic church look like here? I could not say right now. These kinds of things only become clear with some distance. In another decade we can perhaps look back and see clear changes from pre-pandemic to post-pandemic, but it is difficult to recognize those kinds of changes while living through them. Whatever the changes they are in God's hands. We may do some things differently to respond to a changing world, but we will do them because we are following God's leading and direction.
