Note from Pastor Matt

This month at St. Paul's is a busy month. There are many opportunities to be involved and invite your friends and family to participate in life here at St. Paul's. We will be holding our 3rd annual



Oktoberfest again this year. There will be, however, some changes to this event. One of those changes is the date. We will hold Oktoberfest on Friday, October 18 from 5 PM to 9 PM. With the change to Friday night we are also making some changes to the format. Everything will be held in the fellowship hall, food and

music. The menu will also change, we will serve bratwurst and sauerkraut along with hot dogs for the kids and other sides. The other significant change is that this event will be a fundraiser for Boyertown Area Multi-service. All the dinner proceeds will be donated to Multi-service as they pursue the important work of helping those in need in our local community. We are also partnering with Falkner Swamp Nursery School as they will be offering the baked goods available for purchase. It is my hope that through these changes this event can become more of an opportunity for outreach and service rather than primarily an income generator for the congregation.

Another successful outreach event that we have done for the past few years is our Trunk or Treat. We have had many children in the community attend over the past two years and I hope we have another good turnout this year. It will be held on Sunday October 27 from 4 PM to 6 PM. There are several ways you can help with this event. The most helpful is by hosting a "trunk," decorating your vehicle, and handing out treats to all the trick or treaters that attend. If you are unable to host a trunk you can donate treats that can be given out at the event. This event will be held rain or shine. If the weather is uncooperative then we will set up inside the fellowship hall.





Another opportunity to get involved is through our first FaithWorks service project of the program year. We will be collecting items for "Birthday Kits" to donate to the Multi-service food pantry. These are bags given out to families who receive food assistance at the pantry that contain all the items needed to have a birthday party for

a child in the family. We are seeking items like cake mix, a tub of icing, a drink mix, matching party plates, napkins, cups, candles, and balloons. Extras such as decor, toys, tablecloths, noisemakers, and more are also welcome. There will be donation boxes in the narthex to collect the items.

A great way to experience the fun and fellowship of St. Paul's is to join us on our trip to Wilcox Farms to enjoy the corn maze and other attractions. On Sunday Oct 6 we will have some lunch after worship at the church then head out to Wilcox Farms for the afternoon. The group rate for the corn maze is \$6 per person and hayrides are \$4 per person. Look for a signup sheet in the narthex and be sure to invite your friends.



So, yes, there are many different things happening in October at St. Paul's. The most important thing, however, is every Sunday morning. At 9:00 we gather in the fellowship hall for FaithWorks as we learn about the scriptures, share with each other and pray for one another, and serve our community. At 10:15 we gather for worship in the sanctuary where we praise God, hear God's word, ask for God's guidance in our lives and our world, and receive our Lord in Holy Communion. These things are why we are here. Even though all the things happening this month are important, if you must choose and prioritize, choose Sunday morning.




