## **Note from Pastor Matt**

This month is another active month in the life of St. Paul's. On Saturday October 6<sup>th</sup> we will have our 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Oktoberfest. Again this year there will be a pork and sauerkraut dinner in the fellowship hall with live music and entertainment outside. Although this event like others is a fundraiser for the congregation it is also an opportunity to invite your friends, family, and neighbors to spend some time with the people of St. Paul's. Another opportunity to invite people to St. Paul's comes at the end of the month on Saturday October 27<sup>th</sup> when we will have our 2<sup>nd</sup> annual Trunk or Treat. This gives families a safe environment to trick or treat from car trunk to car trunk.

Both of these events provide a good chance to get to know the community and what we are like. It is important that we as a community put ourselves out to the people of our area and let them know who we are and what we are about. The days when people joined a church because it was the expectation and the "thing to do" are over. Very few people will seek out St. Paul's (or any particular congregation) because they feel a need to join a church. That does not mean, however, that people do not need what the church has to offer.

Today, more than ever, people are in need of a community where they are known by others who care about them and their well-being. Of course we are more than that. As the church we not only believe in *Him*, but we believe that *He* with his continued presence in our midst speaks to these concerns and more. That in all these things that weigh us down in today's world we find an antidote in *Him*.

This is why we bother with this thing called faith. Yes, we are concerned with eternity, but we often forget that eternity is not only a place in the future, eternity has to begin somewhere. Eternity like the future begins right now. The eternal life that Jesus brings to us changes things right now, not just someday. So as we set our vision upon eternity and the cares and concerns of today we look to Jesus. We look to him by gathering to worship him, encountering Him in Word and Sacrament. We look to him in our daily life by taking the time for prayer, reflection, and action.



On Sundays, we practice for life. Part of the changes we have made over the past year have been geared toward equipping families to practice faith together. That is why our Sunday school is for everyone, all ages. This is why we are giving new opportunities for children to participate in worship alongside parents, grandparents, and other caring adults. Our primary pursuit is always this, to make disciples as He asked. To fulfill this mission at St. Paul's we are intentionally reaching out to families and households of every size and make up to help them pursue faith in Jesus together.
